BALANCE REIGNS SUPREME AT SENIOR NATIONAL ALL STAR GAME (NASG) DRAFT

This is going to be special.

Princeton-bound Nate Kabiri was tabbed as the No. 1 overall pick by the Nationals team in the 2023 National Senior All-Star Game powered by Nike Lacrosse. The flashy, high-scoring attackman from Georgetown Prep (Md.) was one of four MadLax DC Dogs chosen in the draft alongside faceoff specialist Jackie Weller (St. John's, D.C. / Michigan), LSM Mac Christmas (McDonogh, Md. / Duke) and Colin Burns (Georgetown Prep, Md. / Princeton). The Nationals, captained by five-star attackman Owen Duffy (St. Anthony's, N.Y. / North Carolina) and five-star goalie Caleb Fyock (St. John's, D.C. / Ohio State), went with balance throughout. They chose two attackman, three midfielders, one faceoff midfielder, one LSM, a defenseman and a goalie. That haul included a pair of five-stars in Christmas and goalie Anderson Moore (Briarwood Christian, Ala. / Georgetown).

"Having Owen Duffy, Nate Kabiri, Jack Speidell, AJ Nikolic, Jackson Greene and Elijah Stobaugh as your offensive foundation is absolutely ridiculous," NASG founder Ryan McClernan said. "Those are all very creative and exciting offensive players, and putting them together means there are going to be a ton of offensive fireworks to watch. Our man Greg Keneally of East Coast Dyes better have the camera ready to go for all of the highlights that are sure to happen." The Americans will have an immense amount of firepower in the midfield thanks to the selections from captains McCabe Millon (McDonogh, Md. / Virginia) and Tomas Delgado (Brunswick, Conn. / Duke). Flanking Delgado in the midfield will be Brunswick running mate NLF No. 2-ranked prospect Leo Hoffman (Penn) and future Duke running mate No. 4 Benn Johnston (Avon Old Farms, Conn.). The Americans also snagged the best lefty attackman in the class in Hunter Chauvette (Lawrenceville, N.J. / Yale) and a superb netminder in Duke signee Patrick Jameison (Episcopal, Va.).

"This has to be the best first midfield unit in the history of any high school all-star game," McClernan said. "Hoffman, Johnston and Delgado are all ranked as top-7 players in the NLF Rankings for good reason. They're so dynamic and exciting to watch, and putting the three of them together is like a video game cheat code." The teams will be rounded out with the remaining players by the NASG competition committee. The game is scheduled for 7 p.m. on Friday, July 7 at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium.
